



## Round 6 – Donington National Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2020

### EVENT SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

#### 1. Announcement

Club Time Attack will organise round six of the 2020 Time Attack Championship and an event in the Run What You Brung Time Attack Series at Donington on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2020.

Entries are invited from competitors holding an appropriate Motorsport UK competition licence, driving an eligible vehicle. They must be fully paid up members of Club Time Attack.

The meeting will be held under the general regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), the Championship Regulations, the Run What You Brung Series Regulations, these Event Regulations, together with the Final Instructions and any other Additional Supplementary Regulations or written instructions that the Club may issue for the event. Competitors are expected to read and understand all of the information contained within these documents. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting or any part thereof if circumstances dictate, in which case registered competitors will be advised in writing.

#### 4. Time Attack classes, categories and sessions

Organisers reserve the right to cancel, add, amend or amalgamate classes and sessions. Any changes will be notified in the final instructions or an official bulletin.

#### 5. Eligible competitors

Competitors who have registered and paid for the Time Attack championship will be automatically included on the entry list. Full season competitors unable to enter a round must inform the organisers in advance of the event, or a penalty may be applied.

Single Round Entry and RWYB competitors may enter by joining Club Time Attack and submitting a completed entry application form together with the correct fee at least 7 days before the event. Submission of this form does not guarantee entry.

Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry. Please refer to Championship Regulation Section 1.4.

An entry list will be published with the Final Instructions. Refer to Championship Regulation: 3.1, Entries.

Competitors must hold a competition licence of the following status or higher:

Clubman, Pocket Rocket and Club Classes:	RS Interclub
Club Pro, GT/Sportscar/Prototype, Pro and Pro Extreme Classes:	Race Interclub

#### 6. Eligible vehicles

Refer to the technical sections in the Time Attack Championship Regulations and any Supplementary Regulations that have been issued.

#### 7. Starters

The maximum number of starters in each session will be governed by the track limits specified by the circuit.

#### 8. Entries

The opening date for Time Attack Championship entries was 1st January 2020. The closing date is 7 days before the event. Entries must be made by submitting the official entry form to the championship coordinator, together with the appropriate fee.

#### 9. Driver/vehicle changes

The Championship Coordinator must be informed when a change of driver or car takes place.

#### 10. Judges and jurisdiction

The Judges of Fact will be the Judges, Timekeepers, Post Chiefs, Flag Marshals, Scrutineers, Technical Commissioners and Covid Officer.

Timekeepers will declare the individual lap times throughout the competition.

Post Chiefs & Flag Marshals will declare any infringements affecting safety or any infringement of the signals prescribed in Appendix H of the International Sporting Code and report all incidents or accidents which might occur along the section of track under their control.

Scrutineers and Technical Commissioners will declare any infringement in Pit Lane, Vehicle safety and eligibility.

The Covid Officer will declare any infringement of Covid Guidelines issued by the Championship, Motorsport UK and the UK Government.

The Judges of Fact will be published in an official bulletin in accordance with G10.2.

Flag Signals: As specified in Q.5/Q.15 will be used.

Refer to Time Attack Championship Regulations: Section 2, Sporting Regulations Judicial Procedures.

## **11. Timetable**

Organisers will aim to run the meeting in accordance with the event timetable issued.

## **12. Scrutineering and noise**

There will be no scrutineering on Saturday evening and Sunday morning. Motorsport UK self-declaration forms must be completed by each competitor and submitted by the Wednesday before the event.

Visual checks will be carried out by the scrutineers throughout the event. Full cooperation is required.

Before arriving at the venue competitors should ensure their vehicle complies with Motorsport UK and Championship technical regulations and is suitable for the intended purpose and meets the required class, category and safety criteria.

Competing vehicles must not exceed the official noise limit of 105db at any time during the meeting.

## **13. Signing-on, transponders, wristbands and drivers' briefing**

There will be no signing on at the circuit. Signing on will be via the Motorsport UK self-declaration forms. Competitors must present licences and any required personal documentation, such as medical certificates, when collecting their wristbands and transponders.

Arrangements to collect and return transponders and allocate wristbands will be advised.

The driver's briefing will be held via video link on the Thursday evening before the event. Competitors must acknowledge they have seen and understood the briefing. Further information may be issued.

## **14. Results, protests & awards**

All results will be available on the TSL website.

Protests must be made in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C5 and Covid-19 controls and guidelines.

Details of the awards presentation will be provided in the Final Instructions.

## **15. Final instructions**

A set of Final instructions will be sent to all competitors before the event. This document will have the same force as the Championship Regulations and these Supplementary Event Regulations. The Final Instructions will include:

- Detailed information relating to the meeting
- Covid-19 procedures and guidelines
- Timetable
- Entry list
- Paddock/venue plan
- Pit garage allocations
- Vehicle passes

## **16. Tickets**

No person – whether a driver, a team member or a member of the public - will be allowed into the venue without a valid ticket. Four tickets will be issued to each competitor via MSV's 'Print at Home' system. These



If any competitor or team member feels unwell and suspects they are suffering from Covid-19 symptoms, they must NOT attend the meeting. If symptoms occur during the day, the championship coordinator must be informed and the competitor and their team MUST go home immediately.

The venue has put in place facilities that comply with national guidelines. It has also marked-out areas and erected signs for guidance.

The pits/paddock layout will allow for spacing between teams. A plan will be issued with the Final Instructions.

The pits/paddock area will not be accessible to spectators. There will be a restriction on the number of team personnel permitted to attend. Details will be confirmed to the competitors entered.

Competitors and their team personnel may camp in the circuit paddock overnight on Saturday evening.

Pre-event scrutineering and signing on will NOT take place and WILL require the completion and submission of the appropriate documentation. This will be provided to registered competitors before the event.

The drivers briefing will take place remotely and in advance of the event, via a video link. Competitors must acknowledge they have seen the information otherwise they will not be allowed to start. Further information may be issued.

Organiser-to-team communication on the day and the provision of session results will be carried out via a WhatsApp group. Competitors wishing to communicate with the organisers should do so via a phone call or text and not via the WhatsApp group.

Further details of the safeguards and controls that have been put in place and are applicable at the time in order to mitigate the spread of Covid-19 will be provided in advance of the event.
