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






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Today's meeting at Oulton Park hosts round five of this year's Time Attack Championship, which in 2022 is enjoying its 17th consecutive season.

Time Attack continues to be one of the most popular motorsport disciplines in the UK – and is the only one of its kind in the world.

It's easy to enter too: You can take part in the Clubman Classes with an almost standard car and you don't have to have a full race-licence. Then at the other end of the scale, you can enter the most extreme car you like, providing it fulfills the technical regulations and safety criteria laid down by Motorsport UK. However, you do have to have a race licence if you intend to drive one of these firespitting monsters in the Pro Classes.

As you will see from the entry lists, competitors are split into three sessions and then further split into classes to make things competitive, as follows:

Session 1

Classic & Retro: Cars that are 25 years or older For lightweight track-inspired cars Club Sport: Clubman: Road & track day cars

Pocket Rocket: Smaller engined cars & hot hatches

Session 2

Club Challenge: Two/Four-wheel-drive

modified cars

Session 3

Club Pro: Highly tuned cars running on

treaded tyres

For highly modified cars running Pro:

on slicks

Pro-Extreme: Cars with unlimited modifications

The Clubman Class features cars that are almost standard, with just a mild amount of modification, whilst Pocket Rocket allows cars with smaller engines - such as hot hatches - an arena in which to compete.

Club Class cars feature off the shelf tuning mods, but are restricted to the level of changes that can be carried out a. They are also required to run on roadbased tyres. This rule also applies to the Club Pro Class for dry conditions – although they can run racing wets when it rains - whilst the Pro and Pro-Extreme Classes are able to run on slicks and super-soft tyres. This dramatically enhances the level of grip and consequently, teams are able to increase the power



output of their engines, which means that some of the cars competing today will be developing in excess of 1000 horsepower!

Each round features four sessions of 15-minutes: Warm-up, Practice, Qualifying and the Final. Results are calculated from the times set in the Final session, with points scored towards championship positions based on the results from Qualifying (half-points) and the Final.

Not scoring points, but adding to the mix, are the competitors who make a one-off appearance during the year, or choose to compete in selected events. This offer to teams and drivers has brought with it some great cars and impressive performances and provides yet another exciting element to the eclectic diversity that is Time Attack.

There are exceptions for wet conditions and for cars that require a unique size of tyre that cannot be supplied by Pirelli.





Following the launch of this brand-new championship last year, we are delighted to present Round 5 of the awe-inspiring Motorsport UK Drift Pro Championship - the highest status Drift competition this country has ever seen. Today's event sees the first time the championship has taken place at Oulton Park, which means you'll see history in the making this weekend.

The season kicked off at the beginning of May with Rounds 1 and 2 at Cadwell Park, where Lwi Edwards and Oliver Evans showed everyone how it was done, both taking a win and a second place. The championship then moved to Brands Hatch where two days of fierce competition saw Evans score another victory in round 3, with Paul Cunnington taking the honours in round 4.

For those of you who are fans of this truly spectacular form of motorsport, we'll sure you'll enjoy the non-stop action and dynamic format that comes with this initiative that heralds a fresh new era for the sport.

Before 2021, a fully accredited and officially acknowledged Drifting competition had never been held in the UK. But in a move that defines the top-tier of the sport in Britain and sets out a road map for its future, an innovative collaboration between Motorsport UK (the sport's governing body) and the Time Attack Organisation

inspired the development and creation of the Motorsport UK Drift Pro Championship.

Indeed, the Time Attack organising team are no strangers to the professional side of the sport, having introduced D1 into the UK in 2005 and subsequently the European Drift Championship. Running until 2012, it broke new ground and the introduction of the Motorsport UK Drift Pro Championship has lifted the bar even higher.

» HOW THE JUDGING **WORKS**

Before the competition begins and to ensure they know exactly what the competitors are up against, all of the judges will drift-drive the course. Consequently, drivers and fans can have absolute confidence that the decisions made and the scores applied will be based on real-life experience and first-hand knowledge.

During the tandem battle portion of the competition, the judges will independently determine a winner by comparing the lead runs of both drivers, as well as the chase runs of both drivers during each battle.

Qualifying

The judging criteria for qualifying will be a combination of the following:

- Speed
- Angle of drift
- Line (line is designated by clipping points, outside zones and touch & go areas)
- Style





>>> TANDEM BATTLES

The judging criteria for tandem competition is:

- Lead driver's line, angle and style
- Chase driver's ability to mirror the lead driver's line, angle, speed and style
- Chase driver's proximity to the lead driver

The judges will look for which driver performs better in the tandem battle in both run 1 and run 2, comparing both lead runs to each other another and both chase runs to each other to determine which driver won in each position.

Scores will be calculated from a maximum total of 100 points, as follows:

- Line: 40 pts
- Angle: 30 pts
- Style: 20 pts
- Speed: 10pts

Line scores will be based on a driver's ability to adhere to the line stipulated by the Judges during the driver's briefings. Points will be allocated for outside zones and inner clips, but may also be allocated to zones. Points will be deducted as follows:

- One wheel off the track: 2 points deducted for each offence.
- Two wheels off the track: 5 points deducted for each offence.
- Three wheels off the track: 10 points deducted for the first offence. If repeated during the same run, zero Line points will be awarded for that run
- Four wheel off the track: Zero points
- Further deductions will be made for missing clipping points and partially filling zones.

Angle scores will be judged on a driver's ability to achieve and maintain a high level of angle, as described by the Judges during the driver's briefings. Points will be deducted for the following:

- Lack of angle
- Corrections
- Double-initiation

Style & speed scores will be judged on commitment and fluidity, initiation speed and average speed throughout the run. Points will be deducted for the following:

- Off or partial throttle prior to initiation
- Initiating beyond latest initiation point
- Slowing outside deceleration zones
- Timid approach
- Slow rotations
- Stepped rotations (steering to add small amounts of angle at a time)
- Inaccurate rotations (achieving degree of angle, then adding or subtracting angle)

» THE JUDGES

Deciding on the outcome of the competition are the Judges. That's why we have invited some of the best in the business to join us for the inaugural season of the Motorsport UK Drift Pro Championship:

>>> MARTIN BICHBROS

Having competed in the sport for over 15 years, Martin is one of the most – if not the most – successful British Drift driver ever. Winning the British Championship and multiple competitions across Europe, he is now one of the most respected of his kind in the world.

His legendary Driftworks Nissan R32 is a true icon in the sport, Martin using it to good effect in last year's Motorsport UK Drift Pro Championship.

With a wealth of experience at top-level behind him, Martin knows what it takes to deliver a perfect run and therefore, we are delighted to welcome him to our judging team this weekend.



>>> TYLER HELLY

Tyler is another with a long and successful history in Drfiting and like Martin, has been involved with the UK scene for nearly 16 years. However, his path in the sport has been somewhat different, as he started his Drift career'spotting' for drivers, his skill in being able to convey information earning him a well-deserved reputation.

Working alongside many of the UK's top drivers – including Martin – Tyler's input in providing guidance and advice has helped many to achieve great success at home and overseas. He has also judged other championships in the past, which makes him an ideal candidate to join the Motorsport UK Drift Pro team this weekend.

» MASAYA YUMEDA

Masaya (Maz) has been involved in UK Drift scene since 2005, when he performed duties as a judge and commentator at major Drift competitions. including providing commentary at D1 exhibition events in both the UK and USA. This session provides drivers with an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the circuit and conditions out on track, whilst also ensuring their cars are performing at their best and ready for competition.

QUALIFYING

This is where the field of 21 drivers is whittled down to the Top 16 that will proceed through to the Tandem Battles. Each driver will have two opportunities (runs) to set a perfect 100 qualifying score. Each judge on the panel will score the run out of 100, we'll take an average and that is the score for that run. The score from each driver's best run determines who makes it through to the top-16.

THE TOP 16

Now that we have our top 16 drivers, it's time to start the tandem battles! Drivers are paired into 'battles' and each tandem battle pair will complete two non-consecutive runs competing on track together, with one driver taking the 'lead' on the first run whilst the other driver 'chases' them. These roles are then reversed for the second run. allowing both drivers an opportunity to lead and chase. The judges will determine the winner of each battle after both runs have been completed. Just eight drivers will make it through to the final session.

THE TOP 8

This is where the pressure really mounts up! The top eight drivers are once again paired into 'battles' with the winner of each progressing through to a final shoot out.





The ever-popular Milltek Sport Civic Cup is enjoying its biggest and most competitive season yet and today's two races will see near capacity grids for rounds seven and eight of the 16-round championship. Without doubt, the spectacle of 28 Type-Rs that have been built to a series of carefully controlled technical regulations, fighting for position around Oulton Park's 2.26-mile Island circuit, is likely to provide some of the closest racing you'll ever see.

Two meetings and six rounds have taken place so far: three at Cadwell Park in May and another three at Brands Hatch in June. Winners at Cadwell were Dan Thackeray, George Alp-Williams and Morgan Bailey, whilst at Brands, 2021 Champion Alistair Camp put his 2022 title hopes back on track with two wins from the three races, as Morgan Bailey recorded his second victory of the season in the other.

Camp's Brands Hatch performance, coupled with a second place at Cadwell, sees him jointly lead the

championship with last year's runnerup Matt Luff, who's three second and one third place finish means the Area Motorsport-run pair are on equal points heading into this weekend. Alp-Williams lies third following his round two victory and strong performances in the remaining four rounds.

In the Production Class for cars with fewer modifications, Alfie Jeakins has proved almost unstoppable, having scored five victories from six races, with Loui Hounsell the only driver to have interrupted his clean sweep having won round five at Brands. In keeping with the Cup Class, the Production Class standings are also tied at the top, with Dave Marshall's five second and one third place results seeing him and Jeakins share the top spot, with Hounsell third.

With both classes so close, the scene is set for some fierce competition as drivers battle to leave Oulton Park with an advantage for the second half of the season.

About the championship

Following a landmark year in 2021,

when the Civic Cup joined forces with Club Time Attack that bought with it a fresh approach and saw a significant increase in spectator numbers and the championship's online following, the association continues in 2022 for what promises to be an even more exciting and higher-profile season, with bigger grids and even closer racing.

After the well-received introduction of the Production category in 2021, the championship will again comprise two classes for EP3 and FN2 Type-R models manufactured between 2001 and 2011: the Cup Class for cars running with a controlled set of modifications and the Production Class, for cars that are closer to standard.

In all cases, cars are fitted with Honda's 2-litre K-Series engine and retain many of the standard OE components. Only controlled performance parts may be fitted. Consequently, costs are kept to a minimum, making the Civic Cup one of the most competitive and value-for-money race championships in the UK.

So, if you like the prospect door-to-door competition around one of the UK's most technically demanding circuits, accompanied by an unmistakable V-Tech backing track, then the sight and sound of a grid full of Civics is not-to-be-missed!

This weekend's meeting at Oulton Park hosts rounds eight and nine of the 2022 TCR UK Championship and with 24 cars lining up for today's two races, competitor numbers have never been greater since the series began in 2018.

Launched in 2014, the TCR concept was introduced by WSC (World Sporting Consulting) to level-up touring car racing on a global scale. Such has been its success, TCR now exists in more than 30 different countries and is the chosen platform for the World and European Touring Car Championships. It also forms the basis of national touring car series'in a range of different countries.

The season so far

After seven races: two around Oulton Park's International configuration circuit in April, two at Donington Park in May and three at Brands Hatch in June, the scene is well and truly set for an exciting encounter around the spectacular 2.26-miles of the Oulton Park Island circuit.

In round one, Chris Smiley got his 2022 TCR UK campaign off to a perfect start by taking his Restart Racing Honda Civic Type R FK7 from pole position to victory, the former BTCC front-runner making a seamless transition to the TCR UK arid. Round two witnessed history in the making, when Jessica Hawkins became the first British woman to claim overall victory in a touring car race, the Area Motorsport by FastR driver taking her CUPRA from second on the grid to an emphatic win ahead of the 24-car field.

The racing continued to be exceptionally close at Donington, where Max Hart delivered a perfect performance. The young Irishman took his JamSport Racing Hyundai i30N to a commanding victory in rounds three and four, set the fastest lap in both races and in doing so, increased his lead in the championship standings.

At Brands Hatch it was history in

the making once again, when 2020 and 2021 TCR UK champion Lewis Kent recorded his first win of the season in round five and in doing so, provided the Essex & Kent Motorsport-run Hyundai Veloster with its debut victory in Britain, in an event that marked TCR UK's 50th race.

In round six, a frantic 25 minutes saw a fierce battle at the front of the field that was initially headed by Ant-Whorton Eales, who gave the Subaru Impreza its first ever taste of the lead in a TCR race anywhere in the world. However, it was a charging Jac Constable in his PowerMaxed Racing CUPRA who eventually crossed the line first.

A third action-packed 25 minutes at Brands Hatch witnessed another TCR UK first when 17-year-old Alex Ley became the championship's youngest ever race winner. So, as the season reaches its half-way point, Max Hart holds the championship lead, ahead of the consistently quick Isaac Smith in his Race Car Consultants VW Golf, with Lewis Kent third.

With bigger grids and so many new faces joining this national, multi-marque championship for global specification touring cars, anything can happen. So, strap yourself in and get ready for 2 x 25 minutes of not-to-be-missed action!


